

Andiroba

- Common Name: Andiroba
- Scientific Name: Carapa guianensis
- **General Information:** Medium to large tree native to tropical forests. Heartwood tends to be a pale reddish brown, darkening with age to a medium to dark brown. Quartersawn surfaces with interlocked grain can exhibit a ribbon-like appearance similar to sapele or African mahogany.
- Additional Information: Known for its medicinal properties and oil. Although severe reactions are quite uncommon, andiroba has been reported to cause eye and skin irritation, as well as sneezing.
- Countries of Origin: Brazil, Peru, Colombia
- Countries Where It Can Be Forested: Primarily in the Amazon basin
