

Purple Heart

• Common Name: Purple Heart

• Scientific Name: Peltogyne spp.

- **General Information:** When freshly cut the heartwood of purpleheart can be a dull grayish/purplish brown. Upon exposure—usually within a few days—the wood becomes a deeper eggplant purple. With further age and exposure to UV light, the wood becomes a dark brown with a hint of purple.
- Additional Information: Purpleheart is rated as being very durable, and resists both
 decay and most insect attacks, though it has been reported to be susceptible to attack
 from marine borers.
